Funding Is Still Available Through the Employee Retention Credit Program (ERC)

501(C)PA offers New Mexico nonprofits subsidized technical assistance for eligibility evaluations.

Program Benefits

As a New Mexico nonprofit, you may be able to claim a refund of up to \$5,000 per employee for the 2020 calendar year. For 2021, you may also be able to claim up to \$7,000 per employee PER QUARTER!

"Battered Families Services in Gallup, NM is a small 501c3 non-profit organization providing services for survivors of domestic violence. We thought that we were not eligible for the Employee Retention Credit but, when we heard about this grant-supported technical assistance available from 501(C)PA, we decided to give it a try. The Challenge

ERC eligibility rules are complex and a simple comparison of quarterly revenues can be misleading. Be sure that your ERC eligibility evaluation is thorough and expert before accepting "ineligible" as an answer.

The Opportunity

In partnership with several foundations, 501(C)PA is helping many New Mexico nonprofits discover that they are eligible for significant refundable payroll tax credits in 2020 and 2021.

Get Support

For WK Kellogg Foundation grantees, nonprofit tribal services organizations, or nonprofits based in and operating within San Juan, McKinley, Bernalillo or Dona Ana Counties, 501(C)PA will perform an ERC eligibility evaluation for you and provide a credit of up to \$1000 per organization or related group against their fees. Unless you are a more complex entity, this will typically cover all or most of the eligibility evaluation.

The \$1,000 grant subsidy is also available for ERC evaluations by 501(C)PA for grantees of the Thornburg or Anchorum St. Vincent Foundations, or for nonprofits based and operating in Torrance, Rio Arriba or Taos Counties (thanks to zone grant from McCune Charitable Foundation).

The Process

Once eligibility is verified and the amount of credit is computed by 501(C)PA, the claim process will only require the filing of an amended 941-X payroll report with the IRS for each eligible quarter. The credit is paid to you by check or ACH and the funds are unrestricted and non-repayable.

"I was intrigued by the ERC program and attended a 501(C)PA webinar hosted by San Juan United Way.
